

**AMENDMENT NO. 1 TO THE STATE OF WASHINGTON MPA
FOR MMCAP INFUSE AGREEMENT NO. MMS1900142**

THIS AMENDMENT NO. 1 ("**Amendment**") is entered into on the date all required signatures are obtained for this document ("**Effective Date**") by and between the Washington State Department of Enterprise Services on behalf of the State of Washington ("**Member**") and FFF Enterprises, Inc., a corporation, with a principal address of 44000 Winchester Road, Temecula, California 92590 ("**Vendor**") and MMCAP Infuse, an agency of the State of Minnesota ("**MMCAP Infuse**") regarding the Member Addendum for MMS1900142 ("**MPA**").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Member and Vendor desire to modify the MPA for MMS1900142;

WHEREAS, Member, MMCAP Infuse, and Vendor do not intend to alter, amend, interfere, modify, or adjust the contractual relationship of MMCAP Infuse and Vendor;

THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

Modifications

In this Amendment, changes to pre-existing MPA language will use ~~strike through~~ for deletions and underlining for insertions.

Beginning as of the Effective Date of this Amendment, the pre-existing MPA will be revised as follows:

Revision 1: The following *Subparagraph C. COVID-19 VACCINATION VERIFICATION* will be deleted from *Paragraph 3. VENDOR REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES* in Exhibit C of the MPA:

~~C. COVID-19 VACCINATION VERIFICATION. Vendor represents and warrants that Vendor's personnel (including subvendors) who perform this MPA on-site at Washington state agency premises or at the premises of any Purchaser who so requests, unless properly excepted or exempted, are fully vaccinated for COVID-19. Vendor further represents and warrants that Vendor:~~

- ~~• Has obtained a copy or visually observed proof of full vaccination against COVID-19 for Vendor personnel (including subvendors) who may be subject to the vaccination requirement by any Washington state agency purchasing under this MPA;~~
- ~~• Complies with the requirements for granting disability and religious accommodations for Vendor personnel (including subvendors) who may be subject to the vaccination requirement;~~
- ~~• Has operational procedures in place to ensure that any contract activities that occur on-site at Washington state agency premises or at the premises of any Purchaser who so requests (other than only for a short period of time during a given day and where any moments of close proximity to others on-site will be fleeting — e.g., a few minutes for deliveries) that are performed by Vendor personnel (including subvendors) will be performed by personnel who are fully vaccinated or properly excepted or exempted as may be required by a Washington state agency;~~
- ~~• Has operational procedures in place to enable Vendor personnel (including subvendors) who perform contract activities on-site at Washington state agency premises or at the premises of any Purchaser who so requests to provide compliance documentation that such personnel are in compliance with the vaccination requirement; and~~
- ~~• Will provide to Enterprise Services or Purchaser, upon request, Vendor's COVID-19 Vaccination Verification information and related records, except as prohibited by law, and will cooperate with any investigation or inquiry pertaining to the same.~~

Revision 2: The following *Subparagraph D. WASHINGTON STATE PAY EQUALITY FOR 'SIMILARLY EMPLOYED' INDIVIDUALS* will be added to *Paragraph 3. VENDOR REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES* in Exhibit C of the MPA:

D. WASHINGTON STATE PAY EQUALITY FOR 'SIMILARLY EMPLOYED' INDIVIDUALS. Vendor represents and warrants that, as required by Washington state law ([Laws of 2023, ch. 475](#), § 919), during the term of this MPA, among Vendor's employees, 'similarly employed' individuals are compensated as equals. For purposes of this provision, employees are similarly employed if the individuals work for the same employer, the performance of the job requires comparable skill, effort, and responsibility, and the jobs are performed under similar working conditions. Job titles alone are not determinative of whether employees are similarly employed. Vendor may allow differentials in compensation for its workers based in good faith on any of the following: a seniority system; a merit system; a system that measures earnings by quantity or quality of production; a bona fide job-related factor or factors; or a bona fide regional difference in compensation levels. A bona fide job-related factor or factors may include, but is not limited to, education, training, or experience that is: consistent with business necessity; not based on or derived from a gender-based differential; and accounts for the entire differential. A bona fide regional difference in compensation level must be consistent with business necessity; not based on or derived from a gender-based differential; and account for the entire differential. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, upon breach of warranty and Vendor's failure to provide satisfactory evidence of compliance within thirty (30) days, Member may suspend or terminate this MPA and any Approved Facilities hereunder similarly may suspend or terminate its use of the Agreement and/or any agreement entered into pursuant to this MPA.

Revision 3: The following *Paragraph 7. NONDISCRIMINATION* will be added to *ADDITIONAL TERMS* in Exhibit C of the MPA:

7. NONDISCRIMINATION.

- a. Nondiscrimination Requirement. During the term of this MPA, beginning as of the effective date of this Amendment, Vendor, including any subvendor, shall not discriminate on the bases enumerated at RCW 49.60.530(3). In addition, Vendor, including any subvendor, shall give written notice of this nondiscrimination requirement to any labor organizations with which Vendor, or subvendor, has a collective bargaining or other agreement.
- b. Obligation to Cooperate. Vendor, including any subvendor, shall cooperate and comply with any Washington state agency investigation regarding any allegation that Vendor, including any subvendor, has engaged in discrimination prohibited by this MPA pursuant to RCW 49.60.530(3).
- c. Default. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, Member may suspend Vendor, including any subvendor, upon notice of a failure to participate and cooperate with any state agency investigation into alleged discrimination prohibited by this MPA, pursuant to RCW 49.60.530(3). Any such suspension will remain in place until Member receives notification that Vendor, including any subvendor, is cooperating with the investigating state agency. In the event Vendor, or subvendor, is determined to have engaged in discrimination identified at RCW 49.60.530(3), Member may terminate this MPA in whole or in part, and Vendor, subvendor, or both, may be referred for debarment as provided in RCW 39.26.200. Vendor or subvendor may be given a reasonable time in which to cure this noncompliance, including implementing conditions consistent with any court-ordered injunctive relief or settlement agreement.
- d. Remedies for Breach. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, in the event of MPA termination or suspension for engaging in discrimination, Vendor, subvendor, or both, shall be liable for contract damages as authorized by law including, but not limited to, any cost difference between the original MPA and the replacement or cover contract which damages are distinct from any penalties imposed under Chapter 49.60, RCW. Member and/or Approved Facilities shall have the right to deduct from any monies due to Vendor or subvendor, or that thereafter become due, an amount for damages Vendor or subvendor will owe Member and/or Approved Facilities for default under this provision.
